

Each tournament is specific for year groups and or genders. This provides a lot of children with the opportunity to play and represent their schools.



The spirit of the games values was developed by young people to identify what the experience of school sport should be built around and focuses on personal excellence through participation.

There are seven values which form the 'Spirit of the Games'

PASSION, SELF BELIEF, RESPECT, HONESTY, TEAMWORK, DETERMINATION AND ECO-FRIENDLY.

Pupils have the opportunity to be awarded with these values if they demonstrate one of the 7 values. We award stickers and medals to recognise when we have witnessed a pupil championing one of the 7 spirit of the games. Suggestions for award winners can come from the sport games organisers, umpires, referees and teachers who recognise pupils from other schools.

One of our SEND events we offer is in the form of sitting volleyball.


We had SECAT schools whose pupils had not participated in sitting volleyball prior to attending the sessions, who by the end of the event could not wait to play again.

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Catering Team Update



Limited edition offers are also available to students as well as seasonal and annual event menus.


You may also have seen our SECAT electric van running between schools. Thorpedene Primary School and Nursery run a shuttle kitchen for Bournes Green lunches.

Due to the investment in catering facilities at Thorpedene Primary School and Nursery, they can cater for up to over 500 pupils per day, offering a main meal, dessert and access to the fruit/salad cart each day.

Shoeburyness High School - New IT suite, offices and surrounding area

Following the hugely successful completion of the Humanities area, the estates team have expanded and redecorated the floor below. Reconfiguration of space has allowed for a brand new IT suite to be built and a new office for the Teaching and Learning Team .



Richmond Avenue Primary School and Nursery - New library

Whilst the Richmond library bus has been a unique feature and learning environment at Richmond Avenue Primary School and Nursery, unfortunately it is no longer fit for purpose. A brand new library therefore is being built that will provide the pupils and staff with an exciting and warm environment to read that can be used throughout the year.

During this work, the estates team are also beginning the process of creating a new space for the increase in nursery capacity.

Estates Team Update

Bournes Green Schools - Planning permission for new linking building.

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Our ambitious plans to join both Bournes Green schools continue to take shape! Planning permission has been sought which we hope will be approved soon with building works potentially starting during the summer. Joining our schools will help our staff and children to feel like one school community and should make the transition from Year 2 to Year 3 much less daunting for our children. Also within the plans are one central School Office which will be much better for parents.

Hinguar Primary School and Nursery - Air conditioning

After last years stifling heat during the summer season, air conditioning is currently being installed in all the classes and hall at Hinguar Primary School and Nursery. A lot of the rooms previously had little to no ventilation so the installation of the air conditioning units will bring in fresh air as they cool. This will also move away from gas as a power source for the current heating which will be more economically viable and reduce costs for the school.

Thorpedene Primary School and Nursery - New kitchen ovens

To aid the catering services to Thorpedene Primary School and Nursery and Bournes Green's schools, more efficient ovens with multiple abilities have being installed to the Thorpedene kitchen. Major works have also been done to upgrade the overall kitchen including changing the schools switchgear, digging up the kitchen floor and moving away from gas for a more greener and economical power supply.

We are currently meeting with various members of the community who will be working with us to provide a fun and entertaining day for all of the local community.



ICT Team

As a Trust, we have nearly 2000 end user devices that support the teaching and learning of our children. This is a huge undertaking just to maintain and ensure effective daily running but our ICT Team are also developing our systems to become even more efficient for all of the SECAT community.

News PCs and IT suites

New PCs have been installed at Shoeburyness High School, Richmond Primary School and Bournes Green Junior School. These new PCs are quicker, more reliable and more secure; improving login times for students and allowing them to run the latest software required within the curriculum. This allows the students to have a better experience when using a PC which ultimately improves their learning.

Bromcom payments on MCAS

Parent feedback identified the need to streamline the number of apps that we use. Payments now will be on MCAS allowing parents to use just one login/App (My Child at School) to make payments for all elements of school life; dinners, clubs, trips, music lessons and products. This will help simplify the system both for parents and school administration.

Serverless schools

Hinguar Primary School is almost our first serverless school. We have migrated Hinguar Primary School's data into the cloud and all devices are cloud managed. This means staff and students are able to access all resources and teach anywhere. We are implementing the last changes to the networking infrastructure and then we can finally switch off the servers! This will make savings on server hardware replacements, electricity and technician time to keep them maintained and up to date.

Trilby TV

If you have visited our schools, you hopefully have seen an update to the information screens. As another form of communication, we have installed Trilby TV which is digital signage ensuring that communication within the schools is clearer so that children and visitors are aware of key information and the children's achievements can be celebrated.

Cyber security

As part of the DfE's Meeting Digital Standards and Technology Standards in Schools and College policies, we have been improving our security across our infrastructure and online systems. This ensures our networks are secure and resilient against cyber-attacks.
