I qualified as a teacher in 1987 having gone back to teacher training as a 'mature' student. I began working in Basildon and pretty much since then, have worked with schools in challenging circumstances.

After going through the ranks within the teaching profession, I became Headteacher of Beehive Lane Primary School, a role I absolutely loved. I then took on some work for Essex local authority as a School Improvement Partner whilst also training to become an Ofsted inspector.

I have therefore, been an Ofsted Inspector for 9 years and as a lead inspector for 5 years. Whilst working as Strategic Lead for School Improvement in Thurrock, I was offered the opportunity to become part of Her Majesty's Inspectorate.

Not only have all of these opportunities given me a wealth of experience upon which to draw, they have enabled me to work with a whole range of professionals from the police, social care, counsellors and Headteachers, but also with the most impassioned of groups – you, as parents.

During this time I fostered a co-operative relationship between the governors and the school's leadership team which has proved very effective. Examples such as; steadily improving outcomes for pupils, "good" Ofsted

inspections results and converting the school into an academy.
